THE 4 QUESTIONS FOR... CAROLA STEUR SENIOR MARKETING MANAGER

AMSTERDAMSE POORT (CBRE)

As Senior Marketing Manager, Carola is responsible for the promotion of Amsterdamse Poort, which she does by organising events, making the neighbourhood centre inviting (with festive lighting, outdoor planters, street art, etc.) and overseeing online and offline campaigns. In fact, it's safe to assume that anything you think contributes to the attractiveness of Amsterdamse Poort has probably been approved by Carola, which is enough reason to get to know her better.



WHAT WAS YOUR FAVOURITE EVENT OF ALL LAST YEAR?

"It has to be the Solo Salon. We had a greenhouse set up in front of KFC where people could get free mini beauty treatments, and it was so popular that people were queueing up for it before we'd even opened! It was amazing."

WHAT'S YOUR FAVOURITE FOOD?

"That's always a tough one, isn't it? I like so many things, which is why lunchtime at the Poort is the highlight of my day. I recently had some soft tortillas at the Salsa Shop, and they were absolutely delicious! They're sold in sets of three, and you can choose from a range of fillings. So I always choose different things in order to have a bit of everything: one with chicken, one with beef and one with pork."

WHAT MAKES YOU PROUD?

"I've been working here for a year now, and I've already got to know so many people. People we work with, commission to do things, test things with, and so on. My network is growing, and it's populated by locals, which feels nice. I also love the vibe here. It's great that you can just wander around the neighbourhood and meet all sorts of people, everyone from graffiti artists and entrepreneurs to local residents, whom we've been known to surprise with free oliebollen [Dutch dumplings]."

WHAT MAKES THE POORT UNIQUE?

The fact that 8.5 million people have visited the place in the past year. Few spots in the country attract that many people.

BACK TO SCHOOL

It's almost time! Construction is still under way, but come September and the school will throw open its doors. After more than a year and a half of renovations, the three towers of the architectural monument known as the Zandkasteel will have been transformed into the South East campus of the Amsterdam International Community School, courtesy of the Van Wijnen construction company, on commission for the city council.

ABOUT THE PROJECT

In 2019, the city council bought the three towers of the Zandkasteel, and commissioned Van Wijnen for the transformation of this former bank building into a school. The conversion proceeded in two phases. Phase 1, the exterior renovation, began at the end of March, 2021. This also included work on the interior, with recycled materials to ensure sustainability. The second phase began in March, 2022, and included the cleaning of facades and window frames, the installation of a new roof, and the implementation of energyefficiency measures. The building will be ready for use in August.

ABOUT THE SCHOOL

The Amsterdam International Community School (AICS) is part of the Esprit Scholengroep, which consists of 15 schools in the Amsterdam region. It is designed to serve the expat community in the Netherlands, and all lessons are in English. The Zuidoost (South East) campus was established in 2019, in a temporary building on the Darlingstraat. The school caters for the needs of students of more than 65 nationalities, and its teaching staff is as diverse as its student body. A core part of AICS's curriculum is its "Service in Action" programme, in which students are encouraged to find ways to serve the local community. WORKS UPDATE

Since mid-January, the project developer, 3W, has been working on the new facades and canopy of Cluster 5, the block where Nico's Slagerij and New Metropolis are located. Meanwhile, the HEMA's extension is almost complete, and most of the shops in the cluster now boast new facades, which means the temporary ones are now gone. The facades of the residential buildings have also been refurbished. Over the next few weeks, the contractor will complete work on several things, including the canopy, greenery, and advertising hoardings and signs. If all goes according to plan, the project will be completed in early May.



A HOME IN THE FLIER

The new apartments in the former office building on the Flierbosdreef are now available to rent. The building's temporary tenants will leave on the 1st of June, as permanent tenants will start moving in on the 1st of July. The building, which used to be the premises of the Amsterdam Tax Office, has been converted into a residential complex with 397 flats ranging in size from 25m2 to 49m2. The complex includes a laundrette, and on the ground floor, facing the street, are units for commercial enterprises and a catering establishment. And the best news of all is that anyone who's lived in Zuidoost for at least six years will be given priority over other rental applicants. Want to know more? REPORTING ENVIRONMENTAL HAZARDS OR VIOLATIONS

If you notice an item of street furniture (benches, street signs, pavements, etc.) or something in a park that needs repairing or cleaning, you can report it to the city council. You can also report driving hazards (e.g. obstructions on the road) or noise disturbances from individuals or catering establishments. You can do this via the website meldingen.amsterdam.nl or by calling **14 020**.

Note: If you want to report a problem with a street light, please remember to make a note of the specific lamppost. This is so the city council knows which street light to repair. Litter bins also have individual numbers, which you must provide when making a report about a damaged bin.
